

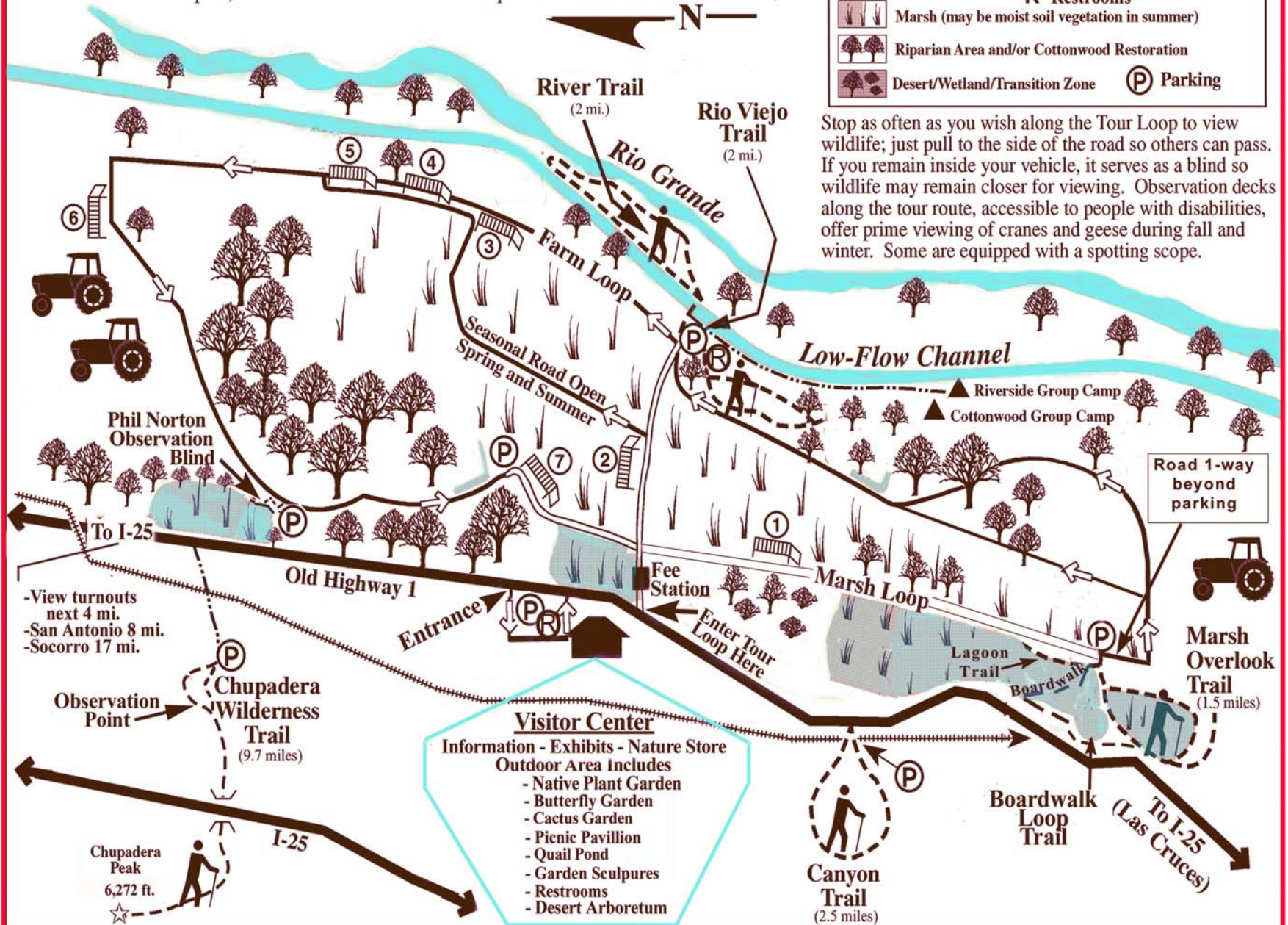
BOSQUE DEL APACHE TOUR ROUTE

The tour is a 12-mile-long, one-way graded road with a two-way cut-off which divides the full tour into a shorter Marsh Loop of 7 miles and a Farm Loop of 7.5 miles. The Tour Loop is open for driving, cycling, and walking from one hour before sunrise until one hour after sunset daily, including Saturday, Sunday, and holidays, except on infrequent occasions when driving hazards may require closure. A fee of \$3 for passenger vehicles is payable at the entrance. Or a 12-month unlimited entry pass may be purchased for \$12. No fee is required if a member of the party has a Golden Age, Golden Eagle or Golden Access Passport, or a current Federal Duck Stamp. The commercial tour bus fee is \$50.

Stop as often as you wish along the Tour Loop to view wildlife; just pull to the side of the road so others can pass. If you remain inside your vehicle, it serves as a blind so wildlife may remain closer for viewing. Observation decks along the tour route, accessible to people with disabilities, offer prime viewing of cranes and geese during fall and winter. Some are equipped with a spotting scope.
